

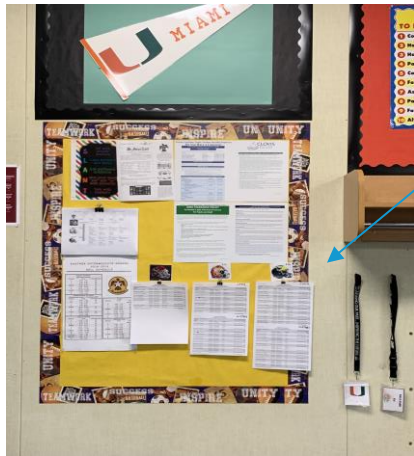
# MR. AVILAS CLASS
